## READ

Luke 2:1-7

From a human perspective, this whole situation must have seemed crazy to Mary and Joseph. Not only was Mary expecting the baby who would save the world, but now she and Joseph had to travel to Bethlehem for the census. When they arrive, there's no room for them to stay except for the place they keep the animals. As hectic as this might have seemed, this is exactly how God wanted Jesus to enter the world. Right from the start, God wanted to have a relationship with us. Even when we messed that up with our sin, God continued to love and make a way to rescue us. Jesus is proof that God loves us unconditionally.

## READ

Luke 2:8-20

After Jesus was born, the first people to find out are some unassuming shepherds in a field minding their own business. The angel announced Jesus' birth along with an angel choir that proclaimed God's peace for everyone on earth. They rushed to see the baby for themselves. They were so excited that they spent the rest of the night telling everyone they could about Jesus. We hope that this Christmas you would come to know God's love and believe that Jesus truly is the Savior of the world.

- How can we have peace knowing God loves us and sent us Jesus?



Christmas is a season filled with anticipation. From the very beginning, the world was waiting for a promised Rescuer to come and make things right with God. At Christmas, we look forward to opening presents and being with family. Most of all, we can't wait to celebrate Jesus, the One who came to fulfill that promise.

Lighting the candles of Advent is a centuries-old tradition throughout the church. It's a chance to reflect on significance of the season and look forward to celebrating Jesus. Here's a simple way to create your own advent tradition. Over the next month, take time each Sunday and countdown to Christmas. Pause and remember the Christmas story. Celebrate how God sent Jesus to be our Savior.

## DIRECTIONS

- 1. Cut along the dotted line.
- 2. Place a tea-light candle on each circle.
- 3. Gather as a family and follow the prompts from the Christmas Countdown:
  - Read the passage from the Bible and the short devotional.
  - Discuss the questions together.
  - Light a candle to mark the week.
  - Pray and thank God for each week of Advent and the anticipation of celebrating Jesus.
